# Mental Health/Substance Abuse Provider to Change

ealthAmerica (formerly Health Assurance) is transitioning its mental health/substance abuse services network to MHNet from United Behavioral Health (UBH), effective September 1, 2008. Coverage will not change for Fund participants and beneficiaries after the transition. There may be some changes to the provider network. HealthAmerica is attempting to limit the impact of the transition process to individuals. The mental health/substance abuse providers for the Devon and Beech Street networks remain the same. More information from HealthAmerica about MHNet and the transition follows.

## Who is MHNet?

providing MHNet has been behavioral health services since 1985 and is accredited by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) and the Utilization Review Accreditation Commission (URAC). We expect the change to occur with the September or October pension checks. Please take a careful look at any mail that arrives from the Pension Fund during that time. It may be your pension check!

to increase. MHNet was chosen for its ability to meet both current and future participants' needs, as well as its ability to offer quality services.

## How do we access providers?

Fund participants will access providers the same as they do today. This will be a seamless transition if the provider is participating. MHNet's transition plan eliminates any need for concern about participants currently receiving behavioral health care services. MHNet guarantees zero disruption of care for covered individals. All participants and beneficiaries currently receiving treatment will be authorized to continue to see their current provider through the entire course of their treatment. This is true even if the provider is not in MHNet's network.

## How does MHNet select their network practitioners and facilities?

MHNet understands the need for a comprehensive network of providers and facilities that meets participants' geographic, clinical, and cultural requirements. To ensure minimal disruption, MHNet has worked closely with HealthAmerica to identify existing quality providers and to initiate the credentialing process for this group. MHNet continuously analyzes area demographics to identify any potential need for practitioners based on language needs, age of the population, and cultural/ethnic mix. When a need is identified, MHNet conducts an exhaustive credentialing process to ensure adherence to a strict set of guidelines established by NCQA. All credentialing criteria must be met before any practitioner or facility is added to the MHNet network.

# When will HealthAmerica begin using MHNet?

September 1, 2008.

## How do participants find out if their doctors participate with MHNet?

Participants can call 1-800-835-2094 to determine if their provider is in-network. Representatives are available Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., EST, for routine needs. MHNet representatives are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at 1-800-835-2094 for critical needs.

## Student Verification Letters Due to the Fund Office by September 30, 2008

Eligible dependent children 19 years of age or older who are full-time students may continue their Health & Welfare coverage until the end of the month following their 23rd birthday provided proof of full-time enrollment is received by the Fund each year from the school they are attending. Students may not continue Health & Welfare coverage if they are employed full-time (with the exception of summer employment).

**Important:** Please contact the institution of higher learning at the start of the fall semester to have this information forwarded to the Fund Office by September 30, 2008. Failure to provide this information to the Fund by September 30, 2008 will result in the cancellation of benefit coverage for this dependent. The dependent will then be offered COBRA continuation coverage in accordance with federal law.

If at any time your child stops attending school or is no longer considered an eligible full-time student, please contact the Fund Office immediately. Coverage ceases when the student is no longer attending school full-time. If benefits are paid by the Fund on behalf of the dependent after they are no longer considered a full-time student, a refund of all benefits paid after that date will be requested.

## HealthAssurance is changing its name to HealthAmerica

**HealthAmerica HealthAssurance**, the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Health and Welfare Fund's primary network provider, is changing its name to HealthAmerica. You may receive benefits communications in the future which refer to HealthAmerica, or your doctor or other health provider may refer to your network as HealthAmerica. Please be assured that the name change has no effect on Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Health and Welfare Plan's provider network or your benefits in any way. You may continue to use your current health plan I.D. card. The Health and Welfare Fund will update member I.D. cards at a future date to reflect the new name.

## What is Reciprocity Service?

Reciprocity Service is service with one or more other Teamster pension plans that is recognized under this Plan, through a reciprocal agreement, for either satisfying your eligibility for a benefit or vesting. If you have service with one or more other Teamster pension plans, please notify the Pension Department so that they can determine whether or not the service qualifies as Reciprocity Service.

A reciprocal agreement is an agreement between two or more multiemployer plans, under which service with any signatory to the agreement is recognized for purposes such as:

- Vesting service
- Fulfilling minimum service requirements for benefit entitlement (eligibility service); or
- Accumulating benefit credits

The goal of reciprocal agreements is to ensure that members maximize their ability to vest in their retirement benefits no matter how many different Teamsters plans they might participate in during their careers. Under a reciprocity agreement, each Plan's requirements must be met, and each plan separately calculates and

pays benefits owed to the participant under the terms of its plan.

# What Reciprocity Service is recognized under the Plan?

Reciprocity Service is recognized for vesting and satisfying your eligibility for a benefit. Depending on the terms of any reciprocal agreement that applies to your service under one or more Teamsters pension plans, your Reciprocity Service may count toward the amount of the benefit you accrue under this Plan.

# How can Reciprocity Service affect my Plan Benefit?

Vesting Service – For participants who retire today, this Plan requires five years of service in the plan before a participant is 100% vested. In prior years, retirement plans had longer required service periods for vesting. Reciprocity Service reduces the possibility that members will fail to achieve a vested interest in receiving a benefit from any and all Teamster pension plans into which they may have had contributions made during their working career.

**Benefit Service** – In addition to meeting any minimum age

requirements, you need 15 years of Benefit Service to qualify for the Plan's Special Early Retirement Benefit, 25 Years of Benefit Service to qualify for the Plan's Combined Minimum Monthly Benefit and 30 Years of Benefit Service to qualify for the Plan's Service Pension.

If you have service with one or more other Teamster pension plans that is recognized under a reciprocal agreement with this Plan, your benefit service with those plans will count toward the minimum Benefit Service requirement for the Plan's Special Early Retirement Benefit and Service Pension Benefit. To be eligible for the Combined Minimum Monthly Benefit (CMMB) under the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Pension Plan, you need to have a minimum of 15 years of Benefit Service (i.e. nonreciprocity service) in the Central Teamsters Pension Pennsvlvania Plan. Additionally, you need to satisfy the "Two Year Rule" and the "45-day Rule." See your plan documents for descriptions of these rules.

# What do I need to do when I apply for retirement benefits?

If you have time in another Teamsters pension plan besides the Central PA Teamsters, you will be asked to provide the employer name, Local Union Number(s) and approximate dates of employment. The Central PA Teamster's Pension Fund needs this information in order to obtain the records of other Plans to determine if you qualify for a reciprocal pension.

If you are requesting a reciprocal pension, the Central PA Teamsters Pension Fund generally requires approximately 6 months notice in order to correspond with the other Teamster plans in which you participated, review the applicable reciprocal agreements, exchange information, verify employment, and process your application.

## Pension Protection Act 2008 Actuarial Certification Notice Mailed in April

he Trustees of the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Pension Fund mailed a notice to all pension plan participants in April 2008. The notice contained good news. Federal law required the Plan's actuary to certify on March 30, 2008 whether the Central Pennsylvania **Teamsters** Defined Benefit Plan fell into one of three problem categories identified under the law (called Endangered, Seriously Endangered, or Critical). The Fund's actuary has certified that the Plan is not in any of these categories. To the contrary, the Fund's benefits as of January 1, 2008 were 85.1% funded. According to the information available to us, this funding percentage compares favorably with other Teamster plans throughout the nation.

Since the Plan is not in any of the problem categories described above, the Plan is not required to implement any of the governmentally required changes to contributions or benefits that other plans across the country are currently adopting in order to overcome their funding problems.

The Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Defined Benefit Plan Trustees will continue to monitor the Plan's health and make every effort to ensure its future success. An analysis will be performed annually in compliance with the Pension Protection Act of 2006.

# Employer Group Coverage Requirements under USERRA

The Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA), prohibits discrimination against persons because of their service in the Armed Forces Reserve, the National Guard, or other uniformed services.

USERRA requires that employees who are called up to active service and who are eligible for their employer's group health coverage must be allowed to continue their health coverage for themselves, their spouse and their dependent children. Individuals electing continuation of coverage on or after December 10, 2004 can elect coverage for up to 24 months. Prior to December 10, 2004, eligible individuals could elect coverage for up to 18 months.

The Act also requires that employers provide an annual notice of USERRA rights and obligations to employees entering military service. This notice requirement can be met by posting the notice in a location where the employer customarily places notices to employees. The requirement also applies to unions that operate hiring halls.

Please call your employer or the Fund Office if you have questions about your USERRA rights.

# The Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act of 1998

nder a federal law called the Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act of 1998, the Fund is required to provide you with an annual notice of your rights under this Act. Please consider this information as the annual notice for 2008 of your rights under this important federal law.

The Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act requires the Fund to provide benefits for mastectomy-related services, including reconstruction of the breast on which the mastectomy was performed and surgery to achieve symmetry between the breasts, prostheses, and complications resulting from a mastectomy, including lymphedema. Any Fund deductibles and copayments that apply to other conditions also apply to the treatment related to the mastectomy. You should feel free to contact the Fund Administrator if you have any questions about your coverage. You can reach the Fund Administrator at 610-320-5500.

This coverage is available under all plans of the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Health and Welfare Fund and is subject to the relevant plan's deductibles and coinsurance provisions.

## Retirees: Direct Deposit Makes Sense

Would you like to be sure that your pension check is available to you on the first business day of each month? You can be certain if you use direct deposit! Eliminate the worries of delayed mail delivery, postponed trips to the bank because of bad weather or other commitments, lost or stolen checks, standing in long lines at the bank, or waiting for your check to clear at the bank.

It's easy to sign up! Just call the Pension Department or visit the Pension Section of the Central PA Teamsters website **www.CentralPATeamsters.com** (click on "Forms") to get the form. Fill it out and return it to the Fund Office. It takes about 30 days to complete the process. Then relax and enjoy the comfort of knowing that your pension check is available to you each month without delay.

**Important:** If you are currently using direct deposit and your name and/or account bank changes, please notify the Pension Department immediately and request a new direct deposit form to complete (even if your bank informs you that no notification is needed.) If you change banks and need to complete a new form, simply call the Pension Department or visit www.CentralPATeamsters.com (click on "Pension" - "Forms") to get a new form. Please note that direct deposit changes usually take 30 days to become effective after you notify the Fund. After you request a change, your first check may be mailed to your home. Thereafter, your check will be directly deposited to your bank account.

# Moonlighting/Self-employment

Fund does not cover he participants or their eligible dependents for illnesses or injuries which arise as a result of performing non-covered employment for wage or profit. Any time such service is rendered for wage or profit, there are no benefits (i.e. medical, short-term disability, etc.) payable by the Fund. Non-covered employment means any employment for which contributions are not made to the Fund. Unfortunately, in the past, there have been cases where the individual was performing odd jobs, i.e. painting, roofing, etc. for which they received payment. The individual was then injured while performing the job and

as a result all bills and shortterm disability benefits were denied. If you or your spouse intend to render services or be selfemployed in any capacity for which a wage or profit



is received, you must have the appropriate liability coverage to cover any injuries or illnesses which arise as a result of performing such services.

## Motor Vehicle Accidents: How Are Medical and Wage Loss Benefits Paid by the Fund?

You should contact your motor vehicle insurance carrier to evaluate the extent to which you are covered for wage loss benefits as a result of a motor vehicle accident.

The Fund Office receives many questions regarding coverage provided by the Fund when the claim is the result of an injury due to a motor vehicle accident. In accordance with Plan provisions, the Fund will <u>only</u> cover medical expenses on a subrogated basis once the maximum liability has been paid by the motor vehicle insurance carrier. In other words, the Fund will consider the payment of medical expenses only after benefits from the automobile insurance carrier have been exhausted.

In addition, the Fund will <u>not</u> provide coverage for short-term disability benefits (except for the first 5 days of missed work) for injuries sustained in a motor vehicle accident.

The only time the Fund will pay more than 5 days of short-term disability benefits is when written proof is submitted verifying that the state in which you reside does not allow you to purchase wage loss protection from your motor vehicle insurance carrier. The state of Pennsylvania allows residents to purchase wage loss protection. It is recommended that you contact your motor vehicle insurance carrier to evaluate the extent to which you are covered for wage loss benefits as a result of a motor vehicle accident. Check with your motor vehicle insurance carrier to ensure that your policy carries at least the minimum coverage required by the state in which you reside.

Do not wait until you have an accident to find out you have no wage loss coverage under your policy. Payment for the first 5 days of short-term disability benefits <u>does</u> <u>not</u> apply to motorcycle accidents. There are <u>no</u> short-term disability benefits payable for injuries sustained as a result of a motorcycle accident.

## **Take the Health Risk Assessment Today!**



The Health Risk Assessment (HRA) questionnaire is free, confidential and easy to use. Simply log on to www.CentralPATeamsters.com, select Wellness Links, click on "Take the Health Risk Assessment" and follow the instructions to register. You will be asked to register a user name and password. After your user

name is registered, you can begin the questionnaire.

The Health Risk Assessment questionnaire asks questions about your current diet, exercise and lifestyle habits. After you complete the confidential HRA (usually in 15-20 minutes), you are provided with a free personalized report which you can use to develop goals for improving your health. You can also share this report with your doctor and your family. Take a follow-up HRA questionnaire in six months to check your progress.

As an additional reward, the Central PA Teamsters Health and Welfare Fund will automatically enroll each HRA participant in a raffle to win one of 8-\$50 VISA cards, compliments of HealthAmerica.


## May 2008 Retirement Income Plan (RIP) Returns

## What is Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is an infection that is spread by ticks. You can get Lyme disease if you are bitten by an infected tick. But most people who have had a tick bite do not get Lyme disease. It's still important to see your doctor if you have had a tick attached to you or suspect you have Lyme disease.

## What causes Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is caused by bacteria. Infected ticks spread the bacteria by biting people or animals.

Two types of ticks carry the Lyme disease bacteria in the U.S. They are:

- Deer Ticks. The spread the disease in the Northeast and Midwest.
- Western black-legged ticks. They spread the disease along the Pacific coast, mostly in northern California and Oregon.

Remove ticks as soon as you notice them. Infected ticks usually don't spread Lyme disease until they have been attached for at least 36 hours.

## What are the symptoms?

One sure sign of Lyme disease is a round, red rash that spreads at the site of a tick bite. This rash can get very large.

Flu-like symptoms are also very common. People in the early stages of Lyme disease may feel very tired and have headaches, sore muscles and joints, and a fever.

Contact your doctor immediately if you suspect you have Lyme disease. Source: WebMD

### What is Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is an infection that is spread by ticks. You can get Lyme disease if you are bitten by an infected tick. But most people who have had a tick bite do not get Lyme disease. It's still important to see your doctor if you have had a tick attached to you or suspect you have Lyme disease.

## What causes Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is caused by bacteria. Infected ticks spread the bacteria by biting people or animals.

Two types of ticks carry the Lyme disease bacteria in the U.S. They are:

- Deer Ticks. The spread the disease in the Northeast and Midwest.
- Western black-legged ticks. They spread the disease along the Pacific coast, mostly in northern California and Oregon.

Remove ticks as soon as you notice them. Infected ticks usually don't spread Lyme disease until they have been attached for at least 36 hours.

## What are the symptoms?

One sure sign of Lyme disease is a round, red rash that spreads at the site of a tick bite. This rash can get very large.

Flu-like symptoms are also very common. People in the early stages of Lyme disease may feel very tired and have headaches, sore muscles and joints, and a fever.

Contact your doctor immediately if you suspect you have Lyme disease.

## Pension Protection Act 2008 Actuarial Certification Notice Mailed in April

The Trustees of the Central Pennsylvania **Teamsters** Pension Fund mailed a notice to all pension plan participants in April 2008. The notice contained good news. Federal law required the Plan's actuary to certify on March 30, 2008 whether the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Defined Benefit Plan fell into one of three problem categories identified under the law (called Endangered, Seriously Endangered, or Critical). The Fund's actuary has certified that the Plan is not in any of these categories. To the contrary, the Fund's benefits as of January 1, 2008 were 85.1% funded. According to the information available to us, this funding percentage compares favorably with other Teamster plans throughout the nation.

Since the Plan is not in any of the problem categories described above, the Plan is not required to implement any of the governmentally required changes to contributions or benefits that other plans across the country are currently adopting in order to overcome their funding problems.

The Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Defined Benefit Plan Trustees will continue to monitor the Plan's health and make every effort to ensure its future success. An analysis will be performed annually in compliance with the Pension Protection Act of 2006.
