



ATTENTION PARTICIPANTS IN THE DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN AND RIP 1987 PLAN:

SUMMARY OF MATERIAL MODIFICATIONS

We are pleased to present you with this Summary of Material Modifications ("SMM"), which provides a descriptive summary of recent changes to the Central PA Teamsters Defined Benefit Plan and Retirement Income Plan 1987. If you have questions or would like additional information, please contact the Pension Fund Office.

New Disability Retirement Benefit Rules for Defined Benefit Plan for 2014

For Participants whose Social Security entitlement date is on or after January 1, 2014, certain changes have been made to the Disability Retirement Benefit.

First, the benefit will be paid in the form of a Straight Life Annuity (i.e., an annuity payable over only the Participant's lifetime) but only until the earlier of (1) the date that the Participant ceases to be Disabled or (ii) the date that the Participant attains Normal Retirement Age.

Second, when the Participant attains Normal Retirement Age, he or she will be entitled to select any form of benefit permitted under the Plan, subject to the spousal consent rules if the Participant is married at such time.

Third, if the Participant dies while receiving a Disability Retirement Benefit, the Participant's surviving Spouse shall be entitled to receive a Qualified Pre-Retirement Survivor Annuity ("QPSA").

All other rules governing Disability Retirement Benefits remain the same.

Defined Benefit Combined Minimum Monthly Benefit ("CMMB") Rule Affecting Participants Who Leave on Account of Disability or Layoff with Insufficient Hours to Qualify on Account of the Two-Year Rule

If a Participant leaves Covered Employment on account of Disability or Layoff and returns within 36 months, he or she will be entitled to make up the hours needed to qualify under the CMMB two-year rule. The Participant must satisfy all of the other Plan requirements in order to receive the CMMB.

Change in the Definition of Spouse and Married to Reflect Law for Defined Benefit Plan and Retirement Income Plan 1987 Effective September 16, 2013

As a result of the Supreme Court Defense of Marriage Act ("DOMA") decision and an IRS ruling impacting federal tax law, the Pension Fund will recognize as married any married same-sex couple whose marriage was recognized as valid in the jurisdiction in which the marriage was entered into, regardless of the residence of the couple. Accordingly, a Participant's same-sex spouse will be entitled to all spousal rights under both the Defined Benefit Plan and the Retirement Income Plan 1987, including the right to a survivor benefit, the right to make a direct rollover to another qualified plan or to an IRA, and other rights accorded spouses under the Plan and applicable law.

Premium Assistance under Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)

If you or your children are eligible for Medicaid or CHIP and you are eligible for health coverage from your employer, your State may have a premium assistance program that can help pay for coverage. These States use funds from their Medicaid or CHIP programs to help people who are eligible for these programs, but also have access to health insurance through their employer. If you or your children are not eligible for Medicaid or CHIP, you will not be eligible for these premium assistance programs.

If you or your dependents are already enrolled in Medicaid or CHIP and you live in a State listed below, you can contact your State Medicaid or CHIP office to find out if premium assistance is available.

If you or your dependents are NOT currently enrolled in Medicaid or CHIP, and you think you or any of your dependents might be eligible for either of these programs, you can contact your State Medicaid or CHIP office or dial **1-877-KIDS NOW** or **www.insurekidsnow.gov** to find out how to apply. If you qualify, you can ask the State if it has a program that might help you pay the premiums for an employer-sponsored plan.

Once it is determined that you or your dependents are eligible for premium assistance under Medicaid or CHIP, as well as eligible under your employer plan, your employer must permit you to enroll in your employer plan if you are not already enrolled. This is called a "special enroll-ment" opportunity, and **you must request coverage within 60 days of being determined eligible for premium assistance.** If you have questions about enrolling in your employer plan, you can contact the Department of Labor electronically at www.askebsa.dol.gov or by calling toll-free 1-866-444-EBSA (3272).

Illegal Acts Exclusion under the Health and Welfare Plan

Please be aware that the Fund will not cover medical services rendered as a result of driving with a blood alcohol limit at or in excess of the applicable limit; as coincident with your ingesting an illegal substance (except for medically necessary substance abuse benefits); or coincident with your participation in an illegal activity, regardless of whether the activity can be characterized as a misdemeanor or felony.

Please refer to your Summary Plan Description for a description of exclusions.

Motor Vehicle Accidents: How Are Medical and Wage Loss Benefits Paid by the Health and Welfare Fund?

The Fund Office receives many questions regarding coverage provided by the Fund when the claim is the result of an injury due to a motor vehicle accident. In accordance with Plan provisions, the Fund will **only** cover medical expenses on a subrogated basis once the maximum liability has been paid by the motor vehicle insurance carrier. In other words, the Fund will consider the payment of medical expenses only after benefits from the automobile insurance carrier have been exhausted.

The subrogation rules above also apply if you are injured while repairing your car or by any other contact with your car.

In addition, the Fund will <u>not</u> provide coverage for short-term disability benefits (except for the first 5 days of missed work) for injuries sustained in a motor vehicle accident. The only time the Fund will pay more than 5 days of short-term disability benefits is when written proof is submitted verifying that the state in which you reside does not allow you to purchase wage loss protection from your motor vehicle insurance carrier. The state of Pennsylvania allows residents to purchase wage loss protection. It is recommended that you contact your motor vehicle insurance carrier to evaluate the extent to which you are covered for wage loss benefits resulting from a motor vehicle accident. Check with your motor vehicle insurance carrier to ensure that your policy carries at least the minimum coverage required by the state in which you reside.

Do not wait until you have an accident to find out you have no wage loss coverage under your policy. Payment for the first 5 days of short-term disability benefits <u>does not</u> apply to motorcycle accidents. There are <u>no</u> short-term disability benefits payable for injuries sustained as a result of a motorcycle accident.

Are You Recently Married, Divorced or Widowed?

Please notify both the Health and Welfare Fund and your employer of any changes in your marital status (married, divorced or widowed) so that the change can be reflected on the Health and Welfare billing statement for proper reporting of dependent coverage.

Please note: the Fund does not consider your ex-spouse to be an eligible dependent under the Health and Welfare Plan after the effective date of your divorce. Members are required to reimburse the Fund for any claims paid on behalf of an ex-spouse after the date a divorce becomes final, based on the divorce decree.

If you become divorced, please forward copies of your divorce decree to both the Health and Welfare and Pension Departments.

Don't forget to review your beneficiary designation following a change in your marital status. It is not necessary to change your beneficiary for Health and Welfare death benefits after marriage or divorce unless you wish to. However, you do need to complete a new beneficiary form for your Pension Benefits after your divorce is finalized.

If you become widowed, please notify the Fund. The Fund will request a copy of your spouse's death certificate. You will need to complete a new beneficiary form for your Pension Benefits. You may also need to update your beneficiary form for your Health and Welfare death benefits.

Downloadable beneficiary forms are available on www.CentralPATeamsters. com (click on Pension or Health and Welfare) or you can call the Pension or Health and Welfare Departments. There are separate beneficiary forms for Pension Benefits and for death benefits under the Health and Welfare Plan.

Moonlighting/ Self-employment

The Health and Welfare Fund does not cover participants or their eligible dependents for illnesses or injuries that arise as a result of performing non-covered employment for wage or profit. Any time such service is rendered for wage or profit, there are no benefits (i.e. medical, short-term disability, etc.) payable by the Fund. Non-covered employment means any employment for which contributions are not made to the Fund. Unfortunately, in the past, there have been cases where an individual was performing odd jobs, i.e. painting, roofing, etc. for which they received payment. The individual was injured while performing the job and as a result, all bills and short-term disability benefits were denied. If you or your spouse intend to render services or be self-employed in any capacity for which a wage or profit is received, you must have the appropriate liability coverage to cover any injuries or illnesses which arise as a result of performing such services.

Are You Headed for Diabetes?

Prediabetes gives you fair warning-and the chance to take preventive steps.

Before they develop type 2 diabetes, many people have prediabetes. This means their blood glucose levels are higher than normal, but not high enough to warrant a diabetes diagnosis.

Still, it's not a free pass. In fact, some new research shows that damage can be done to the body even at the prediabetes stage, especially to the heart and cardiovascular system.

Even more important, taking steps when you have prediabetes can help delay or even prevent the onset of diabetes.

It can be tough to know you have prediabetes, because the symptoms often come on so gradually you might not notice them. But some of the symptoms of prediabetes include:

- Extreme thirst
- Frequent urination
- Blurred vision
- Excessive fatigue
- Frequent infections

Here are some questions to ask yourself to help determine if you could have, or could be at risk for, prediabetes:

• Am I overweight with related conditions like high blood pressure, high cholesterol, a family history of diabetes or personal history of gestational diabetes?

• Does my heritage put me at higher risk for diabetes because I am African-American, Mexican-American, American Indian, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander or Asian-American?

Am I older than 45 and overweight?

If you answered "yes" to any of these questions, you could be headed for potential trouble. Talk to your doctor about simple tests that can determine if you have prediabetes.

The good news is that two simple lifestyle changes can often help control type 2 diabetes.

You can reduce your odds of developing type 2 diabetes by 58 percent by losing 7 percent of your body weight-that's just 15 pounds if you weigh 200 pounds-and getting moderate exercise, like walking, for 30 minutes a day, five days a week.

This may be all it takes to return you blood glucose levels to normal range. When you talk to your doctor, be sure to ask about follow-up tests to keep you on the right track.

IMPORTANT ITEMS TO REMEMBER

(Please note that this list is updated frequently)

- 1. Your application should not be signed and dated more than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is entered in the space entitled "Date Electing to Retire."
- 2. If you are electing to have your monthly check(s) sent to the bank, your FIRST (or next if you are already receiving checks) monthly check will be sent to your home address. It takes 30 days for the direct deposit to go into effect.
- 3. The date of notarization must be the same date you signed the applicable forms in the presence of the Notary Public.
- 4. If you are electing to roll over a lump sum balance, the financial institution to which the money is to be sent can complete the Fund's Direct Rollover Acceptance Form(s), which will be enclosed with your retirement application, or they can provide their own Direct Rollover Acceptance Form(s) or a Letter of Acceptance. In order for their rollover form(s) to be acceptable, please note the following points:
 - a. The acceptance forms must contain the name of the correct plan from which the money is coming. The funds are either coming from the Defined Benefit Plan or the Retirement Income Plan.
 - **b.** If you are electing a partial rollover, the acceptance paperwork must also be marked as a partial rollover.
 - **c.** The Retirement Income Plan is a qualified retirement plan (QRP) or a 401(a). You do NOT have an Individual Retirement Annuity ("IRA") or a 401(k) with the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Pension Fund.
 - d. The acceptance forms must be signed by an authorized representative of the financial institution that is receiving the money (not simply a broker or financial advisor). The signatures must be original.
 - e. All acceptance forms must be originals. Copies or faxes will not be accepted.
 - f. If the acceptance letter references an attached document, the Pension Fund requires the attached document to also be included.
- 5. Your Retirement Income Plan 1987 balance is subject to net gains or losses through the last day of the month in which your application is approved for payment.
- 6. Lump sums from the Retirement Income Plan 1987 are paid no earlier than the 15th of the month and no later than the last working day.
- 7. Your checks from the Defined Benefit Plan (or monthly installment payments from the Retirement Income Plan if elected) will begin on the first of the month following approval of your Retirement Application by the Board of Trustees. Retirement checks are issued on the first business day of the month and represent benefits for the previous month. For example, if your retirement date is October 1, you will receive your first check dated November 1, representing benefits for the month of October. If your retirement date is retroactive, your retroactive payment will be paid in a separate check on the first business day of the month after your application is approved.
- 8. Even if you do not wish to have federal income tax withheld from your Defined Benefit checks, the W-4P Withholding Certificate must be completed and returned.
