## COBRA Premium Reduction Provision under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA)

n February 17, 2009, President Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). This law gives "Assistance Eligible Individuals" the right to pay reduced COBRA premiums for periods of coverage beginning on or after February 17, 2009. Coverage can last for up to 9 months between the period of March 2009 and December 2009.

To be considered an "Assistance Eligible Individual" and get reduced premiums you:

 MUST be eligible for continuation coverage at any time during the period from September 1, 2008 through December 31, 2009 and elect the coverage; AND

- MUST have a continuation coverage election opportunity related to an involuntary termination of employment that occurred at some time from September 1, 2008 through December 31, 2009; AND
- MUST NOT be eligible for Medicare; AND
- MUST NOT be eligible for coverage under any other group health plan, such as a

plan sponsored by a successor employer or a spouse's employer.

Individuals who experienced a qualifying event (that is, became eligible to elect COBRA coverage) as the result of an involuntary termination of employment at any time from September 1, 2008 through February 16, 2009 and were offered, but did not elect, continuation coverage OR who elected continuation coverage and subsequently discontinued it may have the right to an additional 60-day election period.

## **How Much Physical Activity Do Adults Need?**

hysical activity is anything that gets your body moving. According to the Centers for Disease Control's 2008 Physical Activity Guidelines for Americans, you need to do two types of physical activity each week to improve your health – aerobic and muscle-strengthening.

### For Important Health Benefits

Adults need at least:

- 2 hours and 30 minutes (150 minutes) of moderate-intensity aerobic activity (i.e. brisk walking) every week and
- Muscle-strengthening activities on 2 or more days a week that work on all major muscle groups (legs, hips, back, abdomen, chest, shoulders and arms).

#### OR

• 1 hour and 15 minutes (75 minutes) of vigorous-intensity

aerobic activity (i.e. jogging or running) every week and

 Muscle-strengthening activities on 2 or more days a week that work all major muscle groups (legs, hips, back, abdomen, chest, shoulders and arms).

#### OR

- An equivalent mix of moderate

   and vigorous-intensity aerobic activity and
- Muscle-strengthening activities on 2 or more days a week that work all major muscle groups (legs, hips, back, abdomen, chest, shoulders and arms).

#### 10 Minutes at a Time is Fine

150 minutes each week sounds like a lot of time, but you don't have to do it all at once. Not only is it best to spread your activity out during the

## COBRA Premium Reduction Provision

IMPORTANT NOTE: The law provides that no one can elect retroactive coverage for any period prior to March 1, 2009, even if they had a qualifying event or incurred claims prior to March 1, 2009.

Even if you did not receive a formal "lay-off" notice, you may still be eligible to elect subsidized COBRA coverage. Being told not to come back to work until further notice is a termination of employment for purposes of COBRA and the ARRA premium reduction provisions. The election form for this coverage will require that you state affirmatively that you are eligible to elect subsidized COBRA coverage on account of an "involuntary termination." law includes substantial penalties for those who receive subsidized COBRA coverage on the basis of a false statement about involuntary termination.

The Central PA Teamsters Health and Welfare Fund has identified qualified beneficiaries who may be eligible to elect COBRA coverage on account of an involuntary termination since September 1, 2008, based on information submitted by contributing employers. The Fund has sent notices and election forms to those individuals who the Fund believes may be eligible for the COBRA premium reduction.

If you believe you are an "Assistance Eligible Individual" and wish to apply for continuation coverage, but did not receive a notice and election form, please contact the Contributions and Eligibility Department at the Fund Office for further information.

week, but you can break it up into smaller chunks of time during the day. Just be sure to do your activity at a moderate or vigorous effort for at least 10 minutes at a time.

#### Give It a Try

Going for a 10-minute brisk walk 3 times a day, 5 days a week will give you a total of 150 minutes of moderate-intensity activity.

#### **Aerobic Activity – What Counts?**

Aerobic activity or "cardio" gets you breathing harder and your heart beating faster. From pushing a lawn mower, to taking a dance class, to biking to the store — all types of activities count. Just be sure to do your activities at a moderate or vigorous intensity for at least 10 minutes at a time. Intensity is how hard your body is working during aerobic activity.

How do you know if you're doing light, moderate or vigorous intensity aerobic activities? For most people, light daily activities such as shopping, cooking, or doing laundry don't count toward the guidelines. Why? Your body isn't working hard enough to get your heart rate up.

Moderate-intensity aerobic activity means you're working hard enough to raise your heart rate and break a sweat. One way to tell is that you'll be able to talk but not sing the words to your favorite song. Here are some examples of activities that require moderate effort:

- Walking fast
- Doing water aerobics
- Riding a bike on level ground or with few hills
- Playing doubles tennis
- Pushing a lawn mower

Vigorous-intensity aerobic activity means you're breathing hard and fast, and your heart rate has gone up quite a bit. If you're working at this level, you won't be able to say more than a few words without pausing for breath. Here are a few examples of activities that require vigorous effort:

- Jogging or running
- Swimming laps
- Riding a bike fast or on hills
- Playing singles tennis
- Playing basketball

## Muscle-Strengthening Exercises - What Counts?

Besides aerobic activity, you need to do things to strengthen your muscles at least 2 days a week. These activities should work all the major muscle groups of your body (legs, hips, back, chest, abdomen, shoulders, and arms).

To gain health benefits, musclestrengthening activies need to be done to the point where it's hard to do another repetition without help. A repetition is one complete movement of an activity, like lifting a weight or doing a sit up. Try to do 8-12 repetitions per activity that count as one set. Try to do at least one set of muscle-strengthening activities, but to gain even more benefits, do two or three sets.

You can do activities that strengthen your muscles on the same or different days that you do aerobic activities.

There are many ways you can strengthen your muscles, whether it's at home or at the gym. You may want to try the following:

- Lifting weights
- Working with resistance bands
- Doing exercises that use your body weight for resistance (i.e. push ups, sit ups)
- Heavy gardening (i.e. digging, shoveling)
- Yoga

# Prescription Drug Plan Step Therapy Program Implemented Effective January 1, 2009

ffective January 1, 2009, the Health and Welfare Fund's Prescription Drug Plan implemented a new program that affects coverage for new prescriptions of proton pump inhibitors (PPIs). The new program is called Step Therapy. New prescriptions are considered to be for participants who did not receive a prescription for a PPI during 2008.

Proton pump inhibitors (PPIs) reduce the amount of acid produced by the stomach, which in turn reduces irritation of the stomach lining. Widely-prescribed PPIs include Prilosec, Nexium, Protonix, Aciphex and Prevacid. Currently, only Prilosec offers an over-the-counter (OTC) brand and generic version (omeprazole).

If your doctor recommends a new prescription for a PPI after January 1, 2009, be sure to request a prescription for OTC Prilosec or its generic OTC equivalent as a first step. Take the prescription to your participating pharmacy. Your pharmacist will provide you with a onemonth supply. Your co-pay amount will depend upon your prescription benefit coverage (Plan 13, Plan 14 [Option A, B or C] or Plan 16 [Option A, B or C]). Please refer to the Prescription Drug Benefit description page located in this newsletter.

If the Prilosec OTC Prescription drug is effective, your refills for OTC Prilosec or its generic OTC equivalent will be covered under the Prescription Plan. If, however, the Prilosec OTC drug or its generic OTC equivalent is not effective, ask your doctor to write a letter to the Health and Welfare Fund explaining the reasons why the medication was not working properly for you. If this

letter shows that there is a medically necessary reason why you should not use the OTC prescription, the patient will be allowed to use other PPI's if prescribed by his or her physician.

If you or your eligible dependents present a new prescription for a non-OTC PPI at the pharmacy on or after January 1, 2009, your prescription will be rejected for payment. You will need to ask your health care provider for a prescription for OTC Prilosec or its generic OTC equivalent.

Once you have determined that the OTC Prilosec or its equivalent is effective, you may utilize the Prescription Drug Mail Order Program.

### Delta Dental is the Fund's Only Dental Network Provider

for-fee dental insurance program called DeCare Dental Insurance Program, which is sponsored by the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, is being marketed on a nationwide basis. DeCare Dental is currently recruiting dentists in Pennsylvania. Some of these dentists have been contacting Teamsters members regarding the DeCare network.

The Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Health & Welfare Fund does **not** participate with DeCare. Delta Dental is the Fund's only dental network provider. Most of the DeCare providers are **not** in the Delta Dental network. Services performed by dentists in the DeCare network will be considered as out-of-network claims by the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Health & Welfare Fund. The member would therefore be responsible for all non-covered services and balances.

It is possible that members of the Central Pennsylvania Health & Welfare Fund may be misled by dentists who participate with DeCare into thinking that since they are a Teamsters Union member, the dentists' services would be paid in-network by the Fund. Unless the dentists participate with Delta Dental, however, that would not be the case.

## Health and Welfare Coverage for Adopted Children, Step Children and Children of a Custodial Parent

n accordance with the Fund's policy regarding coverage for adopted children, step children, and children of a custodial parent, please provide the Fund with a signed copy of pages one and two of your Federal Income Tax return as proof that you are claiming the child(ren) as your dependent(s).

This information was due in our office no later than April 30, 2009. If you have not done so already, please send it to the attention of the Contributions/Eligibility Department.

If a copy of your Tax return is not received by this date, benefit coverage will cease as of April 30, 2009.

# Motor Vehicle Accidents: How Are Medical and Wage Loss Benefits Paid by the Fund?

You should contact your motor vehicle insurance carrier to evaluate the extent to which you are covered for wage loss benefits as a result of a motor vehicle accident.

The Fund Office receives many questions regarding coverage provided by the Fund when the claim is the result of an injury due to a motor vehicle accident. In accordance with Plan provisions, the Fund will only cover medical expenses on a subrogated basis once the

maximum liability has been paid by the motor vehicle insurance carrier. In other words, the Fund will consider the payment of medical expenses only after benefits from the automobile insurance carrier have been exhausted.

In addition, the Fund will not provide coverage for short-term disability benefits (except for the first 5 days of missed work) for injuries sustained in a motor vehicle accident. The only time the Fund will pay more than 5 days of short-term disability benefits is when written proof is submitted verifying that the state in which vou reside does not allow vou to purchase wage loss protection from your motor vehicle insurance carrier. The state of Pennsylvania allows residents to purchase wage loss protection. It is recommended that you contact your motor vehicle insurance carrier to evaluate the extent to which you are covered for wage loss benefits as a result of a motor vehicle accident. Check with your motor vehicle insurance carrier to ensure that your policy carries at least the minimum coverage required by the state in which you reside.

Do not wait until you have an accident to find out you have no wage loss coverage under your policy. Payment for the first 5 days of short-term disability benefits does not apply to motorcycle accidents. There are no short-term disability benefits payable for injuries sustained as a result of a motorcycle accident.

## Moonlighting/ Self-employment

The Fund does not cover participants or their eligible dependents for illnesses or injuries that arise as a result of performing non-covered employment for wage or profit. Any time such service is rendered for wage or profit, there are no benefits (i.e. medical, shortterm disability, etc.) payable by the Fund. Non-covered employment means any employment for which contributions are not made to the Fund. Unfortunately, in the past, there have been cases where an individual was performing odd jobs, i.e. painting, roofing, etc. for which they received ment. The individual was injured while performing the job and as a result all bills and



short-term disability benefits were denied. If you or your spouse intend to render services or be self-employed in any capacity for which a wage or profit is received, you must have the appropriate liability coverage to cover any injuries or illnesses which arise as a result of performing such services.

## Reminder: Be Sure to Use Your Beneficiary's Legal Name When Completing Your Designation of Beneficiary Forms

Many of us refer to our family members, friends and ourselves by nicknames or variations of real names. It is important, however, to record legal names on Enrollment Forms and Designation of Beneficiary forms for Pension and Health and Welfare Fund Benefits. The Fund Office makes this request in order to avoid confusion by making sure your name and your beneficiary's name matches legal birth, marriage, divorce and death records when a claim is filed.

### Retirees: Direct Deposit Makes Sense!

that your pension check is available to you on the first business day of each month? You can be certain if you use direct deposit! Eliminate the worries of delayed mail delivery, postponed trips to the bank because of bad weather or other commitments, lost or stolen checks, standing in long lines at the bank, or waiting for your check to clear at the bank.

It's easy to sign up! Just call the Pension Department or visit the Pension Section of the Central PA Teamsters website www.CentralPATeamsters.com (click on "Forms") to get the form. Fill it out and return it to the Fund Office. It takes about 30 days to complete the process. Then relax and enjoy the comfort of knowing that your pension check is available to you each month without delay.

**Important:** If you are currently using direct deposit and your and/or bank name account changes, please notify the Pension Department immediately request a new direct deposit form to complete (even if your bank informs you that no notification is needed.) If you change banks and need to complete a new form, simply call the Pension Department or visit www.CentralPATeamsters.com (click on "Pension" - "Forms") to get a new form. Please note that direct deposit changes usually take 30 days to become effective after you notify the Fund. After you request a change, your first check may be mailed to your home. Thereafter, your check will be directly deposited to your bank account.



I am past the Plan's Normal Retirement Age of 65 and plan to continue working. When must I begin receiving benefits from the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Defined Benefit and Retirement Income Plans?

Normally, you must take a minimum distribution from both the Defined Benefit Plan and the Retirement Income Plan no later than the April 1 of the calendar year following the calendar year in which you reach age 70½.

However, the recently enacted Worker, Retiree and Employer Recovery Act waives the 2009 Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from individual account based retirement plans like RIP 1987 and RIP 2000. Accordingly, participants who reached age 70½ prior to 2009 will not have to take the 2009 RMD they would otherwise have been required to take by December 31, 2009. Similarly, participants who reach age 70½ during 2009 will not have to take the 2009 RMD they would otherwise have been required to take by April 1, 2010, although they will need to begin receipt of their benefits from the Defined Benefit Plan, if applicable.

The Pension Fund produces a list each year of participants who will reach age 70½ in that year, based on Fund records. The affected Participants are sent a letter in the calendar year in which they reach age 70½, if they have not already begun the process

for retirement. The letter informs them that they must begin to receive benefits, even if they are still working. A Request for Pension Application Packet is also included. This year, participants who reach age 70½ during 2009 will receive a modified letter that reflects the change in the law referred to above.


Participants who are over the age of 70½ must complete the same paperwork as any other Participant in order to start receiving benefits. The Fund requires at least three months to process the paperwork or six months if the Participant has accrued credit with another Teamster's Pension Fund that reciprocates with the Central Pennsylvania Teamsters Pension Fund.

# How is my retirement benefit affected if I continue to work past age $70\frac{1}{2}$ and have begun receiving my retirement benefits?

If you are credited with the minimum required hours under a collective bargaining agreement, your employer will be obligated to make pension contributions on your behalf. Each January, the Fund will recalculate your benefit based on the contributions received for the prior year to determine if your monthly benefit should be changed. If you are receiving a subsidized benefit under the Combined Minimum Monthly Benefit provisions of the Defined Benefit Plan, you will not receive a benefit increase until the subsidy is eliminated with additional contributions.

# Would I be subject to the Suspension of Benefits Rules if I am still working and begin receiving benefits at age 70½?

The Fund does not suspend benefits for anyone age 70½ or older who is still working.



## Allergy or Cold? How can you tell if you have allergic rhinitis or a cold?

You have a stuffy nose, and you feel lousy. How can you tell if you have allergic rhinitis or a cold? At first, you may think it's impossible to tell the difference. Both colds and allergic rhinitis share similar symptoms of runny, stuffy nose and sore throat. To see if you have a cold or allergic rhinitis, you may have to look more carefully at your symptoms. For a definitive answer, talk with your doctor. He or she can help diagnose you and suggest treatment to help you feel better.

Consider timing. Do you always seem to get a cold at the same time of year? If your nose starts running every spring or fall, you may have seasonal allergic rhinitis and be allergic to specific types of pollen.

**Take your temperature.** Sometimes a low-grade fever is present with a cold, but never with allergies.

**Do you itch?** People with allergic rhinitis may have itchy eyes, throat, and nose, while people with colds don't.

Any aches? Even though both colds and allergies are uncomfortable, people with a cold or flu feel body aches, while allergy sufferers do not.

How long have you had symptoms? Cold symptoms usually last 7 to 10 days and gradually get better. With allergic rhinitis, symptoms last weeks or even months, can come on suddenly, and can go away suddenly, too.

What is rhinitis? Rhinitis makes

the inside of your nose become swollen and irritated. As a result of this condition, you may experience sneezing, congestion, and itchy and "runny" nose. Rhinitis may be caused by allergies or irritants.

What causes nasal allergies? There are several causes of nasal allergies:

- Some people have spring-fall allergies, also known as hay fever.
   These allergies are often caused by pollens from trees, grasses and weeds.
- Other people have allergies all year long. These people suffer from year-round exposure to dust mites, mold, and pets, especially cats.
- Some people think they are experiencing nasal allergies when in fact, their symptoms are due to non-allergic rhinitis. Nonallergic rhinitis can develop with colds, exposure to irritants, such as smoke or perfumes, or for unknown reasons.

#### **Save Your Feet – See a Podiatrist**

Did you know that every 30 seconds a lower limb is lost to diabetes somewhere in the world? In order to prevent diabetic foot complications, including amputation, it is important to know the main warning signs.



Common diabetes warning signs in the feet include:

- Redness
- A change in the shape of the feet
- Loss of hair
- Small areas of skin breakdown or irritation or sign of ulcer formation
- Change or loss of feeling along the bottom of the feet

Including a podiatrist in your diabetes management team — as well as having a proactive attitude about your foot care — can drastically improve your chances of managing diabetes successfully. Check your feet regularly and educate yourself about your condition.

If you discover any of these symptoms mentioned, visit a podiatric physician immediately. A comprehensive foot care treatment plan can reduce amputation rates by 45 to 85 percent.
